Spelling is difficallt enalanging hard.

- Phonics sounding out
- Common exception words (Keywords)
- Homophones where, wear
- Plurals s, es, ies
- Suffixes and prefixes



<u>Suffixes - -ing, -er, -est, -ed, -y</u>

- If a word ends in an e, drop the e and add the suffix eg. hike hiking
- If a word ends in vowel consonant, double the consonant and add the suffix eg. drop dropping
- If a word ends in 2 consonants, just add suffix. eg. jump jumping

<u>Suffixes - -ful, -ness, -less, -ment, -ly</u>

• These suffixes add straight onto root word. eg. enjoyment, careful, fearless, quickly,







