Pastels are a cross between a stick of chalk and a crayon, made of pawdened paint.












We went on a really exciting trip to DIG and the Jorvik Centre. We learned so much more about the Vikings, dug for old artefacts and even went on an interactive ride!










We learned all about the Viking invasion at Lindisfarne. We re-enacted this historical event and turned into monks and scary vikings!













We learnt about where the Vikings came from, why they chose to explore new lands, and specifically where they ended up settling in Britain.


We used our map reading skills to search for Viking place names. It was very interesting to spot the patterns in the names - can you see any similar word endings on this map?










We linked our English learning to our topic by reading How to Train your Dragon'. We used this story to inspire us to write some fantastic dragon descriptions!










In science, we have been learning all about plants. We have carried out investigations into what plants need to grow and learned about each stage of their life cycle.



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
The roots take up water and nedrients from the soil. If there are no nutrients, it will not survive.

Thursday 6th October 2022

In today's science lesson, we conducted an experiment. We are investigating what plants need to grow.

Here is what we did:


- Measured equal amounts of soil, sand, tissue paper, cotton wool and water into 5 separate pots.
- 2. Counted out 15 seeds to plant in each pot.
- 3. Watered each pot with 20ml of water.
- 4. Covered each pot with cling film and pierced 3 holes in the top.
- Made predictions about what we thought would be the outcome of our experiment.





anxieties.


What are you worried about right now?






In other areas of the curriculum....

We have also been learning about the Zones of Regulation. This helps us to identify our feelings and regulate ourselves with a range of different tools.





