

In Year 1 English, we have enjoyed writing firework poems, using our senses. We have also written a non-chronological report all about penguins.

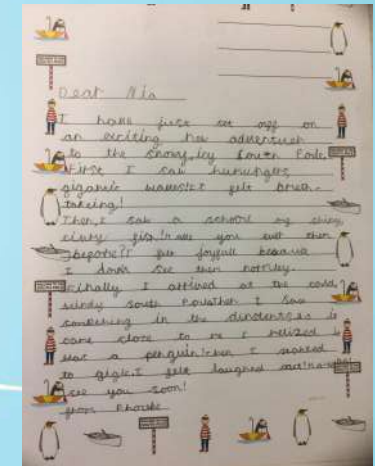
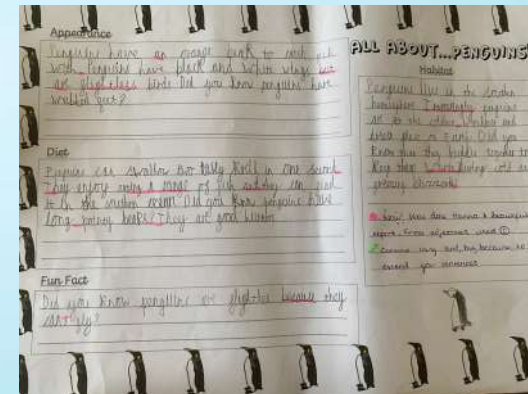
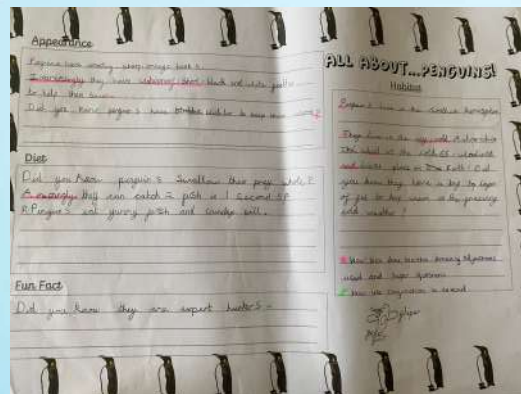
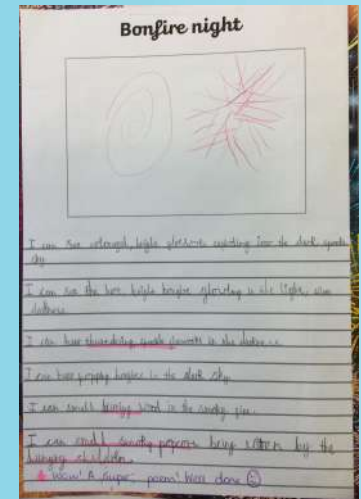
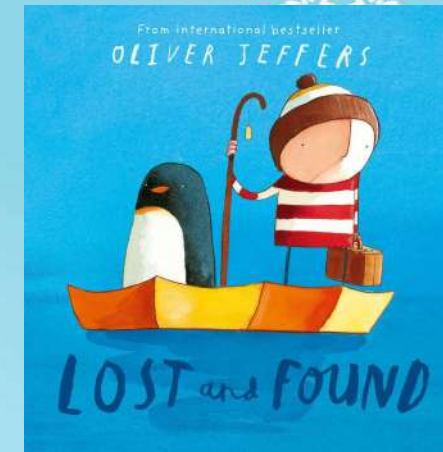
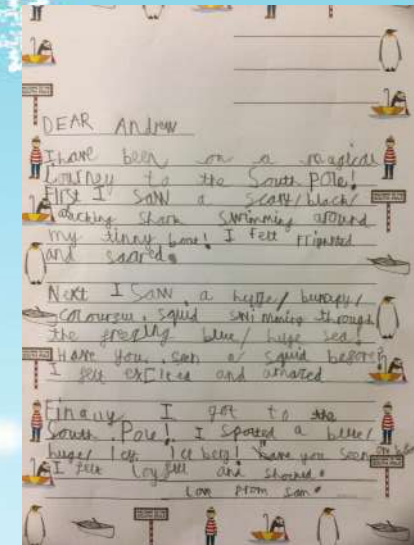
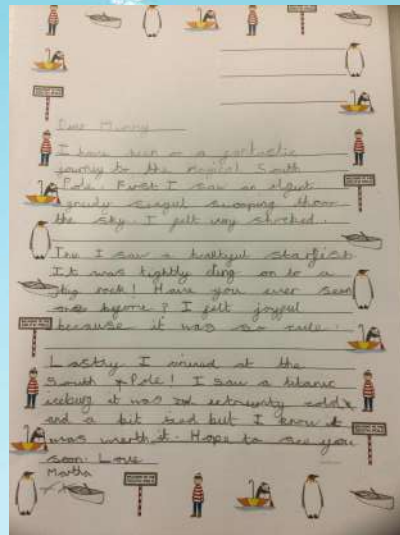
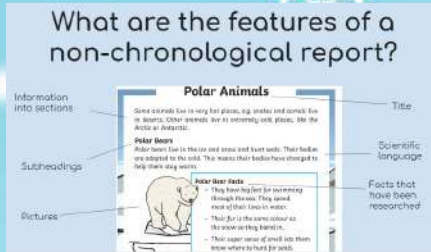

In science, we have learnt about the different seasons but focused especially on autumn and winter this half term. We have learnt about the changes which happen between autumn and winter.

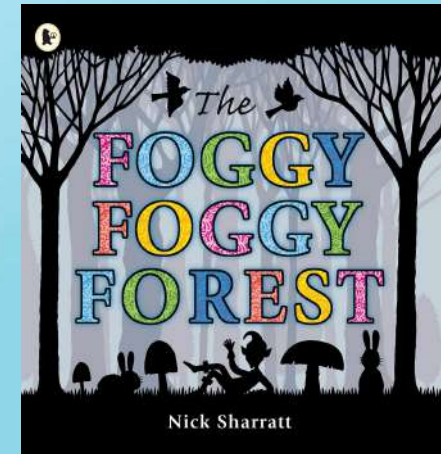

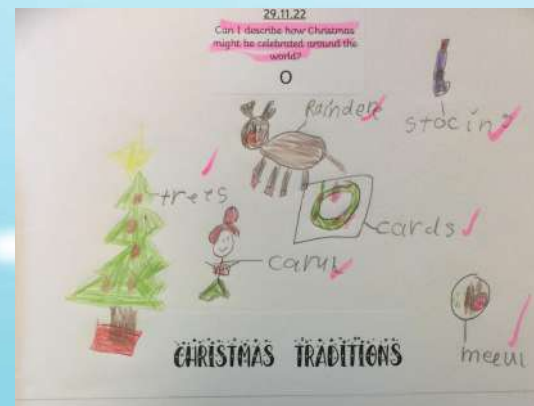
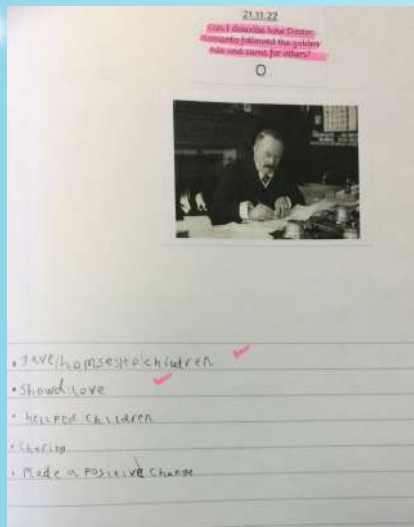
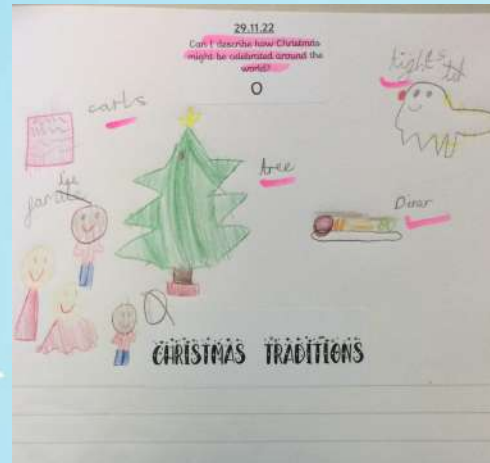


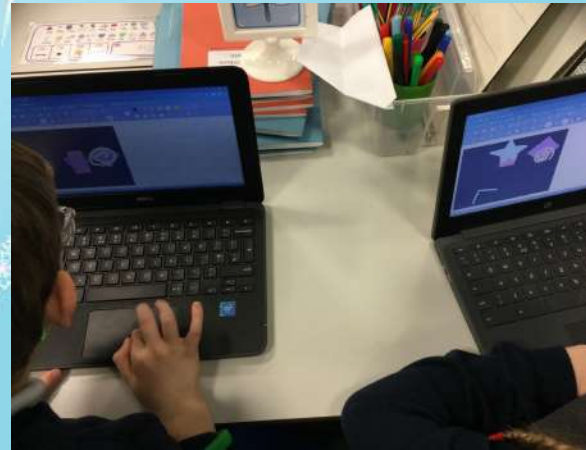
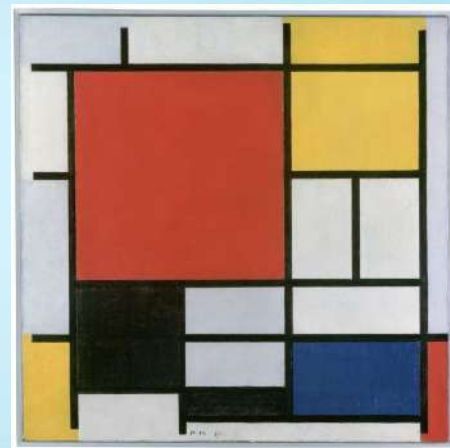
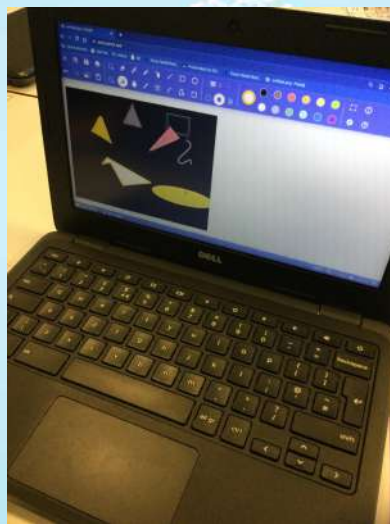
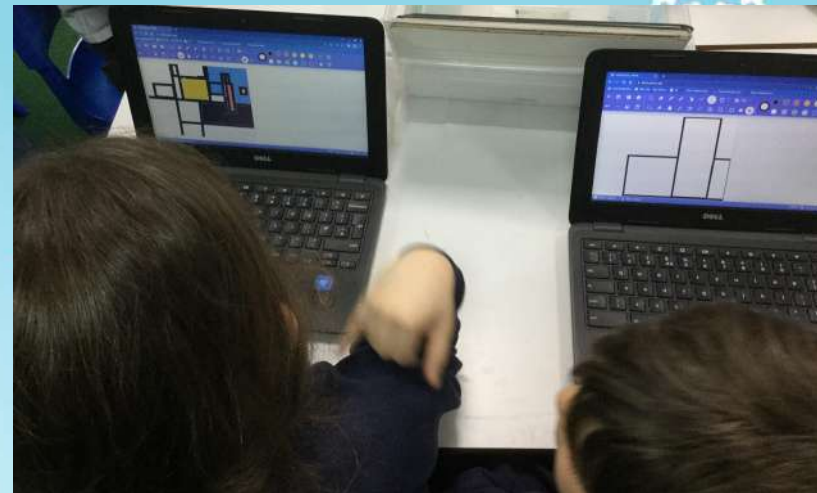
Is caring for others a gift, or a talent, something everyone can enjoy or do?

In RE, we have explored the question 'How should we care for others and the world and why does it matter?'. We have learnt about Diwali and Christmas traditions.





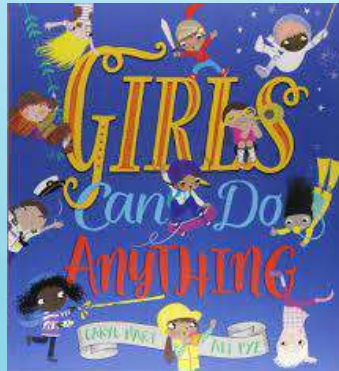
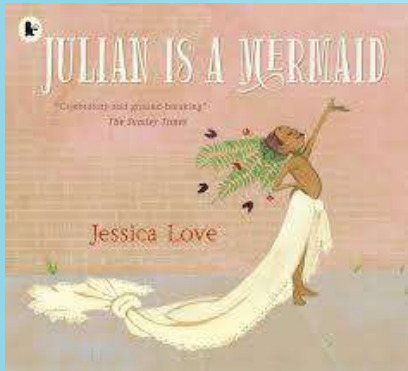
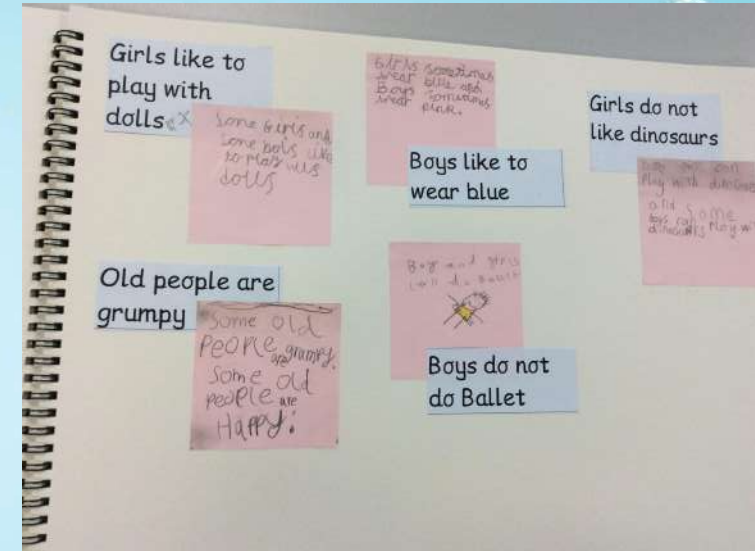
In computing, we have been looking at Digital Art. We went on to the paintz website. We have made Christmas Art and art in the style of Piet Mondrian and Henri Matisse.
