In English, we read the story 'My Pet Star'. We then wrote postcards describing the adventures of the star. After, we wrote our own spring poems which we read to EYFS children.


















Dear YI/2,













In Y2 maths we have been working hard learning about multiplication and division. We have looked at making equal groups and learning our 2, 5 and 10 times tables and the associated facts.
























In science, we have been learning about carnivores, omnivores and herbivores. We also learnt to make our own food chains.



Ramadan

Romadan is a period of ritual fasting. It marks the time when the Quran (their holy book) was revealed to the Prophet Muhammad.

During Ramadan, most Muslims fast. This means they are not allowed to eat or drink during daylight hours. When fasting, they feel hungry and thirsty, which reminds Muslims of people in the world who are less fortunate than themselves. They begin to understand what it must be like for people who don't have much to eat and because of this, many give money to the poor.

Mustims will often have a meat called suboor before sunrise and another called lifter after sunset.



Islam

Islam is the second largest religion in the world.

Followers of Islam are called Muslims.

Muslims believe that there is one true god called Allah.

Allah is the Arabic word for God.









We enjoyed a special visit from Hafsa's Grandad where we learnt all about Ramadan and how it is celebrated by Muslims. We had some great questions!

In PE, we learnt about Gymnastics. We made different gymnastic shapes such as straddle, pike and tuck. We could show this on the equipment too.
















In Spanish, we have been singing songs and playing games to help us learn all about the weather.

had a go at Spanish writing!









We had a great British Science Week! We investigated whether chocolate biscuits are better at dunking than plain biscuits.



















