In the UK there have been several British Monarchs, here are a few of their names: Henry VIII (1491-1547), Charles I (1600-1649), George IV (1762-1830), Edward VI (1537-1553), George VI (1895-1952), Elizabeth II (1926-2022).

Did you know that the Commonwealth (made up of 54 countries) only has one Monarch Queen Elizabeth II used to lead the organisation but after her death it was passed onto her son prince Charles so he will become King Charles III.

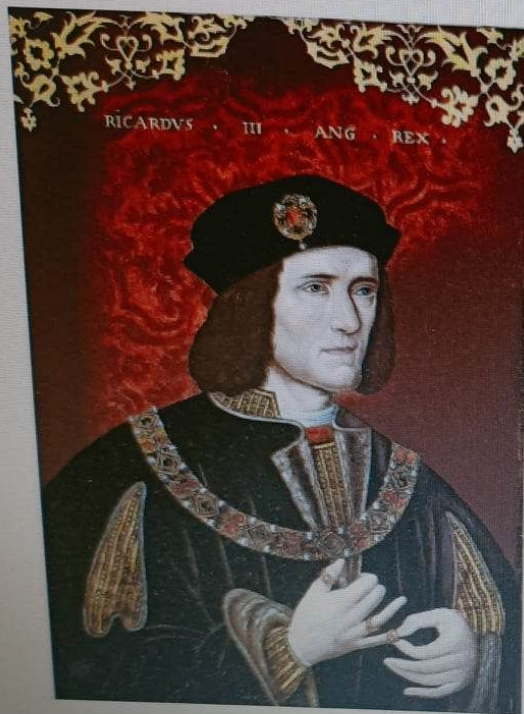
Some absolute Monarchies countries include Brunei, Eswatini, Oman, Saudi Arabia, Vatican City, and the seven territories of the United Kingdom.

Richard III

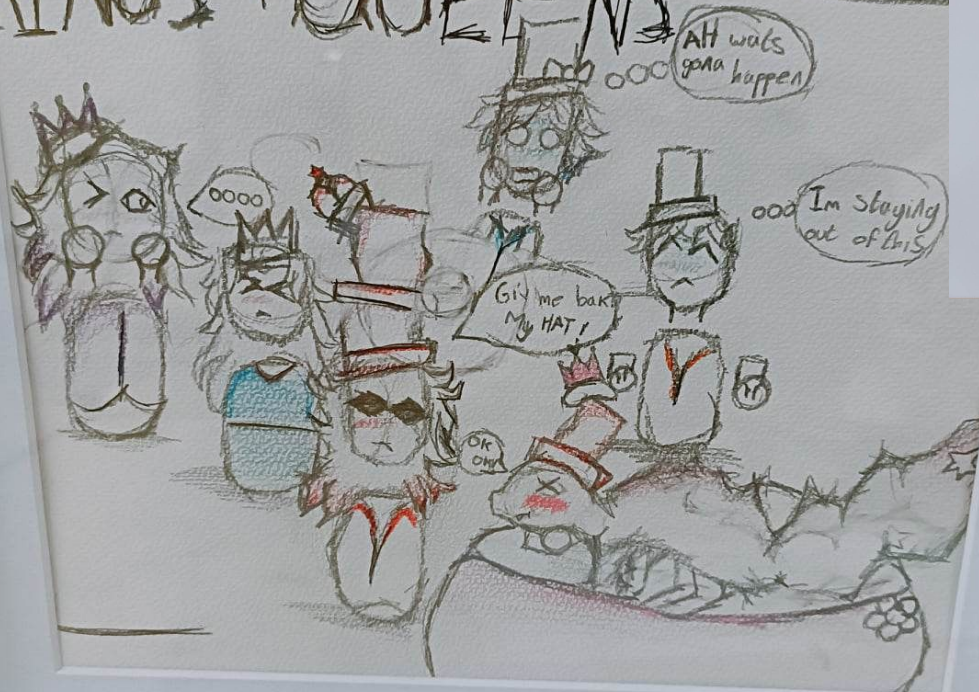
Richard III was born on 2nd October 1452 and was part of the House of York. He only reigned for two years and was killed in the battle of Bosworth in 1485 when his army lost. This battle was the last of the War of the Roses, and the end of the Middle Ages in England.

King Richard III was buried at a church in Leicester but the exact location was unknown until recently. In 2012, Leicester City Council began an archaeological dig and King Richard III's remains were found underneath a car park on the site of the former Great Friars Church. There was great debate about where Richard III's body should be laid to rest, some people thinking that he had a greater connection to York, but in July 2014 his remains were formally reinterred in Leicester Cathedral.

King Richard III can be either seen as either a hero or a villain. His behaviour was often ruthless but that was common for people in power. He was accused of murdering his nephews when they disappeared from London Tower. However, there is no evidence to support this. He was married to Anne Neville who he knew from childhood. King Richard III often argued with his brother George and he got so annoyed he put George in prison where he died.

King Charles III became King of the UK in September 2023 when Queen Elizabeth II, his mother, died. He was the heir to the throne. On the 6th May, King Charles III was crowned. At his mum (Queen Elizabeth II) coronation he ran off with the royal crown, everyone was panicking.



Queen Camilla

Second wife of King Charles III and the one who Charles wanted to marry. She is queen from the 6th May. Prince Charles met Camilla in the early 1970s. The two were reportedly introduced by a mutual friend at a polo match in Windsor Great Park. "She was totally unfazed by all the trappings of monarchy".

Prince William Duke of Wales

Eldest son of King Charles, heir to the throne and has three children. Prince George of Wales, Princess Charlotte of Wales, Prince Louis of Wales.

Prince George was born on July 2013 at Lindo Wing Hospital, London. He is eldest of 3 children, he has a younger sister Princess Charlotte and a younger brother Prince Louis.

Her Royal Highness Princess Charlotte of Cambridge is the second child of Prince William and his wife Kate Middleton. She was born on May 2, 2015 at the Lindo Wing of St Mary's Hospital in London.

Princess Alexandra, The Honourable Lady Ogilvy

Princess Alexandra, The Honourable Lady Ogilvy is a member of the British royal family. Queen Elizabeth II and Alexandra were first cousins through their fathers, King George VI and Prince George, Duke of Kent.

Prince William of Gloucester

Prince William of Gloucester was the world's favorite royal. The prince seemed more like a movie star than a royal. Sadly, that only made his tragic end in front of 30,000 horrified onlookers all the more devastating.



Princess Margaret

Her education was supervised by her mother, and she and her sister were entrusted to a governess. Margaret showed an early interest in music and took piano lessons from the age of four. She was six years old when her uncle, King Edward VIII, abdicated, and her father became King.

Prince Philip

Husband to Queen Elizabeth II and died 1 year before Elizabeth did. He was in the army and was lived till he was 99 years old.



Princess Anne



Anne, Princess Royal, is the second child and only daughter of Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, and the only sister of King Charles III. Anne is 16th in the line of succession to the British throne and has been Princess Royal since 1987.

Prince Edward Duke of Kent

The Duke of Kent was the family's London home. George Nicholas Paul Philip, Duke of Kent and Princess Alexandra Elizabeth II and The Queen.

Richard the Lionheart: General Facts

He was not only King of England, but Lord of Cyprus as well.

He tried to rebel against his father in 1173, but failed.

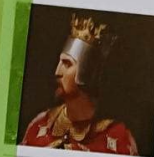
He sold buildings and heavily taxed the citizens to get enough money to wage war in the Middle East.

His brother's death in 1183 made Richard I the heir to England, Normandy and Anjou (Regions of France).



He stayed in England for a few months before he went to fight Philip II (the French king) in Normandy. He was wounded and died on the 6th April 1199. The throne then passed to his younger brother, John.

On his way home from fighting in the Middle East, he was captured in Venice by the Austrian, Duke Leopold. The duke demanded a high ransom for his release and received most of it. Eventually, Richard returned to England.

Richard was born in Oxford on the 8th September 1157. He was the son of Henry II and Eleanor of Aquitaine. He spent most of his childhood in France but moved to England when he became king. He didn't spend much time in Britain, however, because he was of fighting the 3rd Crusade in the Middle East and then fighting in France. Because of his great military skill and bravery he was given the nickname "Richard The Lionheart!"

The Third Crusade was fought in the Islamic territories of the Middle East. The goal was to capture the holy land. Richard the Lionheart was the commander of the European armies that were fighting the Islamic leader Saladin, who had conquered Jerusalem. Richard and his armies only captured a few cities and eventually, truced with their enemies and heading home.

Early Life

Elizabeth Alexandra Mary was born in London 21st April 1926 to Prince Albert, Duke of York (Later known as King George VI) and Elizabeth Bowes-Lyon. When she was born, it was unlikely that she would one day become Queen of the United Kingdom. Elizabeth also known as Lilibet was able to spend the first decade of her life with all of the benefits of being a Princess without the stress of being the heir apparent.

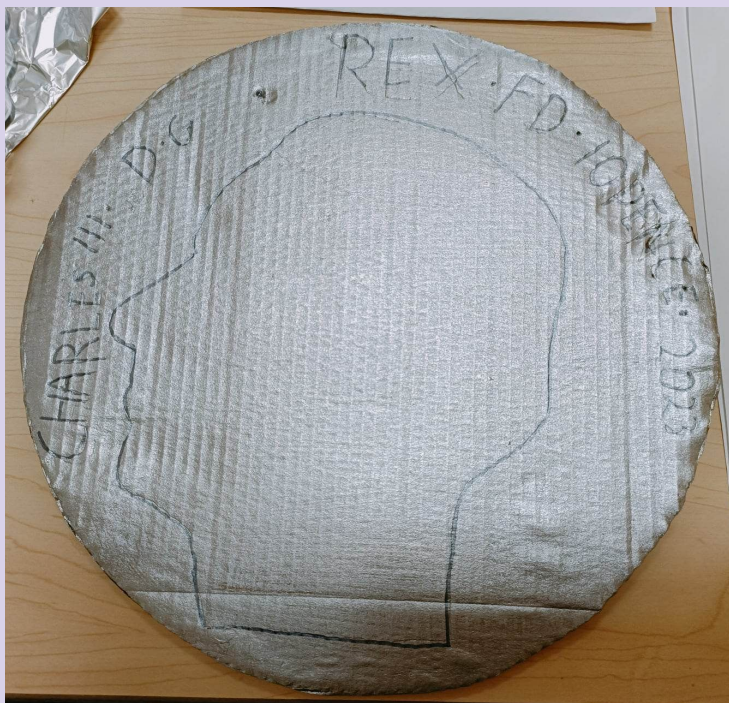
Elizabeth's father and mother split their time between a London home and the Royal Lodge, the family residence in Windsor Great Park. Tutors taught Elizabeth and her younger sister Mary Greek at home. French, Mathematics and history classes were offered as well as dancing, singing and painting lessons.

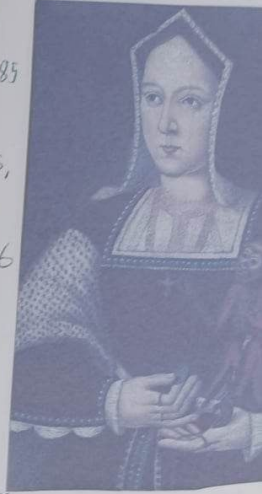
