













Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We are gaining confidence with our stage area now and have heard lots of amazing songs being sung here!






We have been planting a lot this term and understand we need to use our patience to wait for everything to start growing!









We use Drawing Club for our Literacy in the Spring and Summer terms.







Drawing Club has been brilliant this term. We have used the books below to really develop our drawing skills and we are getting really confident with our sentence writing.


