#### Learning for all

From Monday 6<sup>th</sup> November, we are implementing a slightly earlier **start time of 8.45am**. Gates to the playground will continue to open at 8.30am, with doors opening at 8.40am and will close at 8.45am. End times will continue to be staggered with reception at 3.05pm, KS1 at 3.10pm and KS2 at 3.15pm.

Our Early Years children are now ready to join us for our celebration worship on a Friday morning. As the first Friday back after half term is our Remembrance Service, EYFS pupils will stay in phase and join us on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November, which is also Children in Need Day, for the first time. As always, all parents and carers are welcome to join us at 9am for both the Remembrance Service and Friday collective worship.

The Reading Space that so many of you helped to create is already a much-loved area in school. Children are free to use it during playtimes and lunchtimes, with Y6 Oswald Leaders taking responsibility to help look after it. Thank you once again for your support with setting it up. If you would like to see the full list of 100 books to read at St Oswald's, these will soon be published on our school website.

#### Caring for each other

Mr Waterfall-Smith, and his wife Kirstie, have announced the safe arrival of their son, Frankie. We are also delighted to share with you that Mrs Lyon and her husband are expecting their first baby next spring. I am sure you will join me in sending them all our warmest congratulations.

The school value we have been exploring through collective worships this half term has been Respect. I want to thank everyone in school who has led a worship for us, including our new school worship team and Year 5/6 who finished the term with a service in church for their parents and carers. Congratulations to KS1 and Y5/6 who have won our 'dustpan and brush award' for tidiest cloakrooms this half term. They have enjoyed a well-earned treat this week.

We have several families that rely heavily on the disabled car parking spaces in the school car park. Unfortunately, these are often being taken by drivers without disabled parking badges. Please can I ask you to show due care by parking your car elsewhere and leaving these spaces for those who need them most. Careless parking also poses a very real danger to our children leaving school on an afternoon, and we have had some near misses reported to the school office. If you are able to, please walk to school and if not, consider other places to park outside of the car park if it is full.

A reminder that for safety, bikes are not to be used in the playground at drop off and pick up time.

#### Preparing for the future

The price of our school meals will be increasing from 6<sup>th</sup> November by 25p per meal to £2.75. You should have received a separate letter regarding this on Wednesday. If you think that your child may be eligible for a free school meal and you currently do not claim, we'd encourage you to visit https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals for further information and guidance. The school office team would be happy to support you to fill out any forms that need to be completed. Please contact them in confidence.

Places at our Night Owls after-school club are very popular, with certain nights of the week booking up very quickly far in advance. **If you have booked a space that you no longer need, please contact the school office as soon as possible** so that we can make the place available for another child to use. Any bookings that are cancelled 24-hours in advance, will be refunded. We have also expanded our extra-curricular provision to try and provide other activities on the evenings that are most in demand with our families.

Due to the development of Germany Beck, our school is now oversubscribed, with a waiting list of pupils who would like to attend. As a result, City of York Council are in the early stages of planning an extension to our school, whereby two additional classrooms will be built. This work is projected to take place by September 2025. I will of course keep you updated with any details and developments to these plans in my future newsletters.

On Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> November, St Oswald's Church are hosting a coffee morning from 9.30-12 noon in the Church Hall. All are welcome for a hot drink, cakes and company. No purchase is necessary, you're invited to pay as you can.
