Assessments have been taking place this half term to help us measure the progress your child is making in their core areas of learning, and to inform our teaching moving forwards. We love reading at St Oswald's and as part of our **World Book Day** celebrations, we would like to welcome parents and carers into school for a 'stay and share a story' session. For those who are able to join us, please enter school at 8.45am with your child via the library entrance (on the relevant day - see overleaf). The school hall will be set up ready for an enjoyable and relaxed session where you can share a story with your child. The Early Years story session will be held in the classrooms. World Book Day itself will be celebrated in school on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> March, and children are invited to come in costume as their favourite book character. Over half term, your child may like to take part in the School Council competition to create a story book.

It has been great to see the children able to enjoy all of the outdoor areas during playtimes and the level of physical activity increase. Thank you for supporting us by providing wellies for your child to wear, and forgiving us for the muddy uniforms that I'm sure you've been collecting at the end of each day!
