


We got our topic off to an exciting start with a few environmentally friendly Stunning Start activities, focussing on Reduce, Reuse, Recycle.




We took old magazines and newspapers and turned them into beautiful art pieces.


In Year 3 Maths, we have been practising sharing and grouping. We then went onto learning a formal method of 2-digit \times 1-digit long multiplication.










For global warming, cars are the problem. You could stop using cars which use petrol, and change to an electric car.


In plastic pollution, it's in the name, plastic's the problem! You need to recycle plastic, paper, metal cans, ect. Don't throw them away, save the planet!

A Christian lets someone else go first in a game.













Our Art focus has been 'printing' this half term. Look at our amazing skills we have been practising!

We have done lots of speaking and listening practice. A favourite game was ¿Quién soy? (Who am I?)




Señora T. was really proud of all the lovely posters that the children made! Here are some super examples by Phoebe and Tilda.
